


In the tenth year of partnership between SUEZ and Suffolk County Council, we've put 286,588 tonnes of waste to good use generating enough electricity to power 51,584 homes*.



* Based on the mean consumption of all domestic meters in the East in 2023 being 3,574.8 kWh (www.data.gov.uk). This figure will fluctuate as the amount of electricity used by households changes year on year.

The energy-from-waste process is one of the most tightly regulated industrial processes in Europe. At the Suffolk facility, both SUEZ and the Environment Agency monitor the facility to ensure it operates within the conditions set out by the environmental permit. Flue gas is treated throughout the process to ensure compliance with the permit limits.
